

**Introduction**

This course is created based on the joint effort between HKUST Finance Department and Reuters. The objective of the course is to give HKUST students first hand experience in using Reuters terminals and provide them with a firm foundation of analytical skills and practical market knowledge. This will give them an advantage over other students in today's competitive job market.

**Target Students**

The class will be available to third-year business students, with priority given to students majoring in finance.

**Class Size and Format**

There will be no lectures given by HKUST faculty. Trainers from Reuters will provide demonstration of Reuters terminals. The maximum enrolment is limited to 24 students.

**Class Venue and Schedule**

All four training modules are scheduled in the Reuters training room located on 42/F Gloucester Tower, The Landmark, Central, Hong Kong.

**Requirements**
