continuity planner (CBCP), a certified fraud examiner (CFE), and a certified information system auditor (CISA). He holds both a Master and a Bachelor Degree on business administration.

The roles and functions of a CIO have evolved over the years, from the **AUTOMATION era** (1965 – 1975), to the **INFORMATION era** (1976 – 1986) and to the **TRANSFORMATION era** (1986 - ).
